

ORDINANCE NO. 115

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE USE OF PUBLIC PARKS WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF PERRINTON, AND TO GOVERN SUCH USE.

THE VILLAGE OF PERRINTON ORDAINS:

Section 1. "Public park" as used in this ordinance means any park, playground, recreation area or other area owned or used by the Village of Perrinton which is devoted to public recreation.

Section 2. Public parks shall be used by the public and may be put to all the uses reasonably associated with public parks, subject to the restrictions contained herein, provided that no such use shall violate any law of the State of Michigan or any ordinance of the Village of Perrinton.

Section 3. Public parks within the Village of Perrinton shall be open to the public between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. No person shall occupy or be present in any public park during the hours that it is not open to the public; provided, however, that Village personnel, officers, or employees upon official duty or conducting Village business shall not be so restricted. No member of the public at large except as set forth above shall occupy or be present in any public park during the hours it is not open to the public unless permission for such occupancy has been granted in advance by the Village Council.

Section 4. In a public park, no person shall park a vehicle in any area other than an established or designated parking area.

Section 5. No person shall camp or set up any temporary shelter for the purpose of overnight accommodation in any public park without the prior written consent of the Village Council.

Section 6. No public meetings shall be held in any public park without the prior written consent of the Village Council.

Section 7. In a public park, no person shall:

- A. Expose or offer for sale any article or thing;
- B. Announce, advertise or call public attention in any way to any article or service for sale or hire.

Section 8. Violation. Any person convicted of violating the terms of this

ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not more than \$500.00 and/or imprisonment for a period of not more than 90 days.

Section 9. Separability. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.


Section 10. Ordinances Repealed. All ordinances and/or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 11. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 20 days from and after its enactment as provided by the Village Council.
